

Considerations In Calculating Equipment Downtime Costs

Detection Costs



Initial discovery of the issue with the printer can vary, depending on what safeguards are in place to alert to an equipment issue.

Containment Costs



Temporary fixes until equipment can be fixed and back in service should be taken into account.

Productivity Costs



With a piece of equipment that is out of service, there are fewer pieces of equipment in operation to handle production.

Recovery Costs



Once equipment has been fixed, there is still a ramp up needed to get production back to baseline levels.

Lost Revenue



This is the most easily measured cost – the direct impact of less production out the door to the company's bottom line.

Third Party Costs



This could be missed inventory deadlines and longer-term damage to customer relationships.
